The VFW Library Post 6664, located at 6544 Church Street in South Park, will host Memorial Day events on Monday, May 27, 2024.





enjoy a luncheon at the Post 6664 parking lot after the ceremony.


The Historical Society will participate in Post 6664 events, and the Society's Museum will be open and invite the public to view our many military photographs, information, and artifacts displays.

Saying Goodbye

Grace Lutheran Church began in 1906 when the chapel on Cochran's Mill Road Extension was constructed for \$2,000. The Pittsburgh Coal Company donated the property. The church was organized under the leadership of Rev. C. V. Sheatsley, pastor of Zion Lutheran Church.

The members erected a new Grace Lutheran Church on 4.3 acres on Hilldale Drive in South Park Township. It was dedicated on October 19, 1969. The 100th Anniversary was celebrated on September 14, 2006.

Due to the decline of membership, the church council had to make a final decision to close the church. It was a sad day for all when the final service was held on December 31, 2023.


ARCHIVED HISTORY

The veterans memorial information below is from the Society's "The History of Snowden/South Park Township" book.




The picture above is of the original Library Veterans Memorial in 1942. It was located on the hillside at the Library and Brownsville Roads intersection (near the current traffic light in the Library). This monument listed all the men from the Library area serving in the military during WWII. It was replaced in 1946 by the current Library (Archie Mathias) Veterans Monument on Brownsville Road in Library.

A smaller veterans memorial was erected by the residents of the Piney Fork area to honor WWII veterans of the Piney Fork, Knothole, and Snowden areas of Snowden (now South Park) Twp. It is at the intersection of Brownsville and Piney Fork Roads.



The above photo is of the Broughton Veterans Memorial in 1953. It replaced the original monument that stood in the same spot. The memorial listed the residents of Broughton, Curry, and Bruceton who were in the service during WWII. **Snowden High Senior Eagles**





"The Jury is in. Bob Jury personally charged his South Park teammates by scoring all three touchdowns, leading the Eagles to their third straight victory, 20-14, over West Allegheny last night."



"Jury ran back a punt 80 yards in the first quarter, took a 40-yard pass from Ron Blasich in the second and scored from 28 yards out in the third."

"West Allegheny (0-3) got its score in the last quarter on a 25-yard pass, Dave Chappel to Frank Williams."

"Both Jury and David Lee gained over 100 yards."
